Matched Savings Accounts



Building Assets For:

- Home Ownership
 - Small Business
- Higher Education
- Personal Vehicle

What is FAIM?

The Family Assets for Independence in Minnesota (FAIM) Program is a 30-month matched savings project that helps Minnesota low-wage earners build assets in the state through enrollment in one of the following tracks:

- first home purchase
- post-secondary education
- small business startup/expansion
- personal vehicle purchase

Contact a local FAIM agency to apply. Once enrolled, the participant will reach their goal by making monthly deposits from their earned income into a Family Asset Account (savings account opened through the program). Deposits made to the account within 24 months may be matched 3:1 by the program* (\$2,000 maximum lifetime savings per household). The participant has up to an additional 6 months (if needed) after the end of their saving period to obtain their asset **in Minnesota**.

Savings/Match Example:

Potential Total Asset Funds	\$8,016
FAIM 3:1 match on \$2000	\$6,000
Save \$84 monthly for 2 years	\$2,016

*Previous household enrollments affect eligibility for the program and/or match availability.

Purpose of FAIM

FAIM helps participants change their saving and spending habits, including consumer debt reduction. Before accessing FAIM funds, the participant must successfully complete:

- a minimum of 12 hours of financial management training provided by the local agency
- an additional 10 hours of asset-specific training
- asset-specific requirements for their chosen track

FAIM funding is appropriated through state legislation. The program:

- target enrollment is the working poor in Minnesota
- provides subsidies through matched payout rather than through tax breaks
- provides financial counseling and requires the account holder to complete financial education classes.

Eligibility for FAIM

The FAIM applicant must:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Be a Minnesota resident throughout enrollment
- Be a US citizen, or eligible non-citizen
- Have earned income to deposit in savings monthly
- Have household (HH) gross annual income below 200% of federal poverty guideline
- Have household net assets under \$10,000
- 1. Household income and assets may increase *after* enrollment into FAIM.
- 2. Asset obtained with program funds must be located in Minnesota.

*200% of 2022 Poverty Guideline

Add \$9,440 for each additional person in the home
